Scripture Reflection by Father Matt

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus,

The gifts of the Magi reveal Christ in different ways. Gold, the currency of this world, honored Jesus as a king. Frankincense, usually reserved for use in religious rituals, honored Him as God. The symbolism of myrrh, however, is more complex.

Myrrh was a rare gum used in medicine, mixed with oils for sacred anointings, and applied to bodies for mummification in ancient Egypt. Thus, the gift of myrrh could have been to honor Jesus as a healer, as a priest, or as one who was to die. The Eastern Churches use myrrh as a symbol of the presence of the Holy Spirit. Even in the Catholic Church, our Sacred Chrism oil, blessed by the bishop for baptisms, confirmations, and ordinations, is often scented with myrrh. The smell of myrrh always reminds me of my ordination as a priest, when my hands were covered in this Chrism oil. Its use in the Sacrament of Baptism is a subtle reminder that we are baptized into the death of Jesus as well as His resurrection. We are reminded at that baptismal anointing, too, that we are to serve as priests, prophets, and kings in imitation of and in union with Jesus.

With these richly symbolic gifts, we recognize in the child Jesus the dignity He bears as King of Kings, as God-with-us, and as the true High Priest who has entered for ever into the tabernacle of Heaven. We acknowledge from the beginning that He came to die in order to conquer death forever. We recognize Jesus as the perfect Sacrifice offered to God for the forgiveness of sins.

May the gifts of the Magi inspire us to offer our riches to Jesus for His use, and may the Feast of the Epiphany of our Lord Jesus Christ reveal to us the great gift of His Presence among us in the Eucharist and in His Body, the Church.


ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Caravans of Camels

About those camels, we are not too sure about them. Yes, every nativity scene shows the Magi seated on stately dromedaries, or leading their beasts of burden by bit and rein. But, quite honestly, the story of the Magi never tells us how they got there. They could have traveled on foot, in chariot, on horseback, on elephants, or by camel—but we just do not know.

The reason we keep putting them on camels in our art is because of Isaiah's prophecy. He predicted that caravans of camels would fill Jerusalem and that people from the East would come bearing gold and frankincense. "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem!" he proclaims. "Your light has come."

In Matthew's story, the Magi realize that Jerusalem's light has come. They follow the star and bring their gifts of gold and frankincense. Myrrh, too. By telling about these gifts, Matthew turns our attention back to Isaiah. Reading that prophecy, we realize that the light Isaiah mentioned is the Light of the World, Jesus Christ.

When we see the Magi seated on camels, we are remembering Isaiah. When we remember Isaiah, we remember the light that came to shatter the darkness of our world. Those camels carry hope.

The Epiphany of the Lord

Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Secret Plan

The birth of Jesus became the worst-kept secret in the history of the world. All along, people knew God had a plan. God had told everyone from Adam and Eve, to Abraham and Sara, to Moses and Miriam, to David and Bathsheba, to Hosea and Gomer, to Mary and Joseph that there was a plan. Nobody fully understood it. Nobody knew how God would bring the plan to fulfillment. But they all believed. They had seen God work mighty deeds in their lives, and they believed that one day the promise of redemption would be fulfilled.

Jesus was God's secret. When Jesus was born in humble surroundings outside of royalty and pageantry, only a handful of people even began to realize what God had done.

But the secret got out. Angels appeared in the sky. Shepherds showed up. And Magi traveled from a faraway land. Everyone was finding out God's two great surprises: Jesus was born as the promised Messiah, and he came not just for his own race but for all the people of the world. The Letter to the Ephesians says, God's mystery "was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit." Jesus was born, and he came to save each of us, no matter what family we come from, what we believe, or how we behave. The mystery of God's love is open now to the whole world. That is the epiphany, the revelation of God's secret



Sacraments

Families that would like their children to be baptized or receive the sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation or couples that would like to be married here should be registered and active members of the parish.

Sacrament of Baptism: Requirements for having your child baptized at the Church of St. Henry are: registration at St. Henry (or another parish) and attendance at a pre-baptism class, which is normally offered every two months. Parents are encouraged to take the class before their child is born. For more information, call the parish office at 218-346-4240. Please note, this class is only required if this Baptism is for your first child. **Pre-registration required.**

Sacraments of Confirmation/First Communion: Please contact the Religious Education Office at 218-346-7030.

Sacraments of Penance/Reconciliation: Please contact the Religious Education Office at 218-346-7030 for first time Preparation.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office at 218-346-4240 or in emergency call 218-298-2030.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples that want to be married in the Catholic Church need to go through a Marriage Preparation course and need to meet with the priest or deacon at least six months in advance of the wedding.
